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Health and Safety Plan

The faculty and staff of Fellowship Christian High School, together with our school board, has developed a comprehensive health and safety plan for the 2021-2022 academic year as scheduled. This includes cleaning and disinfecting all physical spaces and high-touch areas on our campus; safety guidelines for students, staff, faculty, and visitors; modification to schedules; and modification to physical spaces. This letter elaborates on each of these important aspects of our plan below.

Masks/face shields are optional for teachers and students in the classroom and building (disposable masks will be available if needed). Note: This policy will be revisited throughout the school year as needed.

Entering school building:

- We recommend that staff/students/parents do a self-assessment at home before coming to school. Do not send your student to school nor come to campus yourself if you or your student is exhibiting two or more of these symptoms listed here:
Fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea (note: symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. If exposure, please inform the school).
- If a student registers a temperature exceeding 100.4°F, parents will be called and asked to pick their student(s) up to go home.

Guest, Parents and Visitors:

- All guests, parents, and visitors are required to call the school upon arrival.
- Parents/visitors are not permitted to enter the building during drop-off or pick-up.

In the facility:

- Common areas including the lunch room will be cleaned and sanitized by staff/lunch duty crew before/after use.
- Disinfection will occur regularly of commonly used surfaces and bathrooms.
- Disinfecting wipes and hand sanitizer will be available in common areas.
- Classroom and hallway doors will be open to allow ventilation and airflow.
- Water fountains will **not** be available for students, staff, parents, and guests.
- Students may bring their own water bottles to be used throughout the day.

In the classroom:

- Upon entering a classroom, hand sanitizer will be available for students to use.
- All classrooms will have disinfecting supplies: gloves, masks, disinfecting wipes, disinfectant spray, paper towels.
- Seating will be 3-6 feet apart as much as possible.
- Classrooms will be disinfected regularly.
- Masks will be recommended when physical distancing cannot be achieved (students and teachers) in compliance with established classroom physical distancing guidelines.

Physical education:

- Activities to be outside as much as possible.
- Masks are optional during activities if physical distancing cannot be achieved.
- All sport/recreational equipment will be cleaned and sanitized before and after usage as much as possible.

Chapel:

- Chapel service will continue to be held with physical distancing in place (mask is optional).

Lunch Room:

- There will be NO self-service food or beverage distribution.
- Students/parents are encouraged to pack all lunches individually.
- All meals, snacks, and beverages must be individually packaged. NO sharing!!
- Individual water bottles/or disposable water bottles are required. (No glass bottles or containers.)

Computers/Equipments/Personal Items:

- All school-provided computers/equipment will be maintained with surface cleaning between every use.
- All students are required to provide their own computer.
- Students can only use equipment and learning materials that have been issued/belong to them.
- All personal items brought to school by students/staff must be disinfected prior to and after use.

Physical Distancing Exposure Reminder:

- Stay 3-6 feet apart when possible.
- Students will be instructed on proper hygiene (handwashing for 20 seconds, fully covering coughs and sneezes, correct usage of masks, etc.).
- **As a reminder, masks are optional when in the hallways, in between classes, to the bathroom or lockers, to the main office, and for dismissal, except for entering school buses based on your school district.**
- Any student who exhibits a temperature greater than or equal to 100.4°F will be isolated and rechecked after ten minutes. If the elevated temperature persists, the student will remain isolated until a parent is reached to take the student home. Any staff who exhibits a persistent elevated temperature greater than or equal to 100.4°F will be asked to isolate himself or herself and leave campus immediately.
- Hand sanitizing stations will be available in the hallways.

COVID-19 Infection

- Any person, student, staff, or visitor who contracts COVID-19 is to be quarantined at home for 7-10 days (as per the CDC guidelines) and contact their primary doctor.
- Any student exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 will be immediately isolated and sent home. The student will be required to be quarantined for 7-10 days, follow CDC guidelines, and contact their primary doctor.
- Should a student or staff member of the school be exposed to someone who tests positive for COVID-19 they will be asked to quarantine as per the contract tracing guidelines of the CDC and return after the 5-10 days with NO symptoms or negative testing.

(Note: These procedures are continually updated as the guidelines change. Last update: 1/14/2022)
